- Filing fee for recordation of license agreement for the use of certain works in connection with noncommercial broadcasting under 17 USC 118
- \$50 Recordation of certain contracts by cable television systems located outside the 48 contiguous states
- \$25 Notice of use of sound recordings under statutory license (17 USC 112 and 114)
- \$25 Amendment of 17 USC 112 and 114 notice
- \$0.50 Photocopy made by staff (B&w) (per page, minimum \$12)
- \$165 Search report, per hour
- \$165 Certification of search report
