I have been trying to locate a Dr Anthony Wright, an Australian, who wrote his PhD thesis on the 1965 War between Pakistan and India and had interviewed a large number of persons involved in the war. Most of these people are no longer alive and, since this thesis is now the only first hand account of people who have died, it is an important source material for scholars and authors.

As the head of Oxford University Press, Pakistan, I would like to publish and disseminate this thesis by publishing it and distributing it world wide. However, the university in Australia, which is in possession of the thesis, does not provide a copy without the author's permission and the author is untraceable.

It is imperative that such orphan works are made available to bona fide publishers with the proviso that, if authors or their heirs are traced, royalties will be paid to them on the publisher's standard terms.
